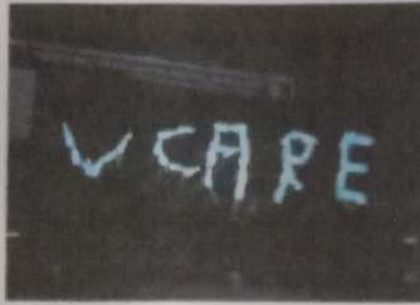
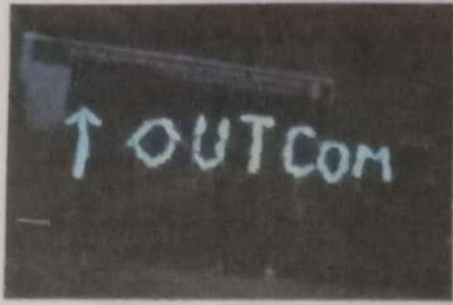


The posters on International Women's Day with the theme 'Pledge for Parity' were displayed for competition and exhibition.

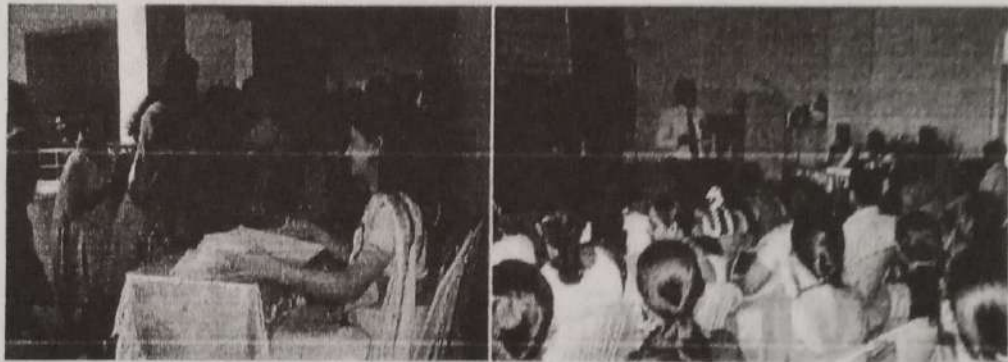
"An Other Step Forward"

The session was followed by a short cultural program by the 4th B.Sc Nursing students



Second session was by Dr Hareesh Gouda, Associate Professor, Dept of Forensic Medicine,


FMMC, on the topic 'Preventing legal issues in psychiatric clinical practice' at 11am. Dr

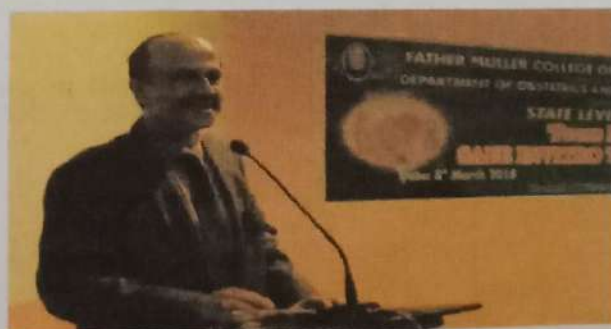

Day 2

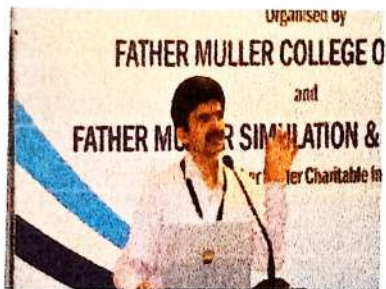
The theme of 2nd day was learning competency based education from health care educators.


