

Celebrating three jubilees of 25, 30 and 60 years simultaneously is a joy forever. Triple Jubilee Celebration is one of the rarest opportunities that we get at Father Muller's. We draw immense satisfaction from the success of our students who are well placed today and who do well in India and abroad. We are truly proud of our students and dedicated staff.

Indeed, nurses are an indispensable and balancing link between the helpless patient and the specialized doctor. Nursing care is a thing of solace for the patient and the doctor and accounts for the greater part of the healing process. Till 1959 the nursing services at Father Muller's were carried on by the Sisters of Charity with the help of nursing aides. Sisters Candida, Angela, Alphonsa toiled day and night to provide maximum care to the patients.

By the year 1953, Dr Venkat Rao felt modern nursing training was an imperative need and the Director Fr Marian Fernandes also felt the need for starting a nursing school. On July 15th 1959, with the efforts of the founder Principal Sr Maria Theresa, the School of Nursing became a reality when 12 candidates were admitted. Working with dynamic directors and doctors, she laid a strong foundation for the future of nursing in Father Muller Institutions. "As a formula for good nursing, nothing can replace the love and kindness", she says, stressing the need of love and care in the healing ministry of the hospital. Fr Marian too had at the back of his mind the welfare of Catholic girls, as training them would make them economically independent. With the starting of nursing school, there came about a change in attitude towards nursing.

Foreseeing the need for advanced training of nurses, the College of Nursing was started in 1987 with the initiative of Fr Peter S. Noronha with a 4 year degree course. This became the first private sector nursing college in the state of Karnataka (indeed, it was the first College under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences to secure the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) certificate with a redoubtable 'A' grade). People actually laughed when they heard of the B.Sc. degree course. Where is the need, they said, we have such an excellent Nursing School whose students are accepted not only in India, but abroad too! But Fr Peter Noronha did the right thing, which was confirmed when another college was started in the same year in Dakshina Kannada. The Post Certificate B.Sc. Nursing Degree Course of two years duration was started the next year, 1988, for upgrading those with Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery, so that the diploma holders could improve their qualification. The M.Sc. Nursing programme was added five years later in 1992.

At the forefront of Father Muller Charitable Institution's march of 137 years, nursing

stands on a firm foreground, proclaiming that at the centre of suffering is a nurse who provides succor, constantly offering solace and counsel. About 2500 under graduate and 750 Post graduates have successfully walked out from the portals of College of Nursing and are ambassadors of our College in different countries. The nurses trained by the institution are known Nationwide for their dedication to patient service and professional commitment. Along with the School of Nursing, Father Muller College of Nursing is so well known and so well reputed that even in the medically most advanced countries like USA, Canada, UK, Ireland, Isarel, our nurses are welcomed with open arms. Those who have gone there earlier have created such a reputation that everyone respects the quality of their service and the College they come from.

Being one of the oldest hospitals in this region with over 1,800 outpatients and 1,000 inpatients serviced everyday, the Father Muller Charitable Institutions is aware of the pivotal role played by the nurses at various levels in the hospital, specially in the operation theaters, ICU and MICU, Paediatric and Medical/Surgical specialties. The nurses have worked hand in hand with the doctors and others to cheer up the patients and nurse them back to health. Even at the moment of death, they have extended their support by consoling the relatives. The patients are indebted to them for the advice provided when the patients were discharged.

We all have heard the story of a boy walking at the beach who saw hundreds of starfish being washed to the shore by the tides. The boy picked one and threw it back into the water. He did that repeatedly. Behind him there was another person who couldn't understand what this boy was doing. He asked, "What are you doing? There are hundreds of starfish. How many can you help? What difference does it make?" This boy picked up another starfish, threw it into the water, and said, "It makes a difference to this one." Indeed, it is nursing care that makes a difference to the patient. Successive Principals and staff of the School and College have given a strong imprint of quality, redefining the profession to the changing needs of the patients. Father Muller School and College of Nursing stand tall among the 2500 nursing schools and 1800 nursing colleges in India, with Prokeria.com listing Father Muller College of Nursing, Mangalore among the top 10.

Certainly, the School and College of Nursing are a source of immense joy and happiness to all of us in the Management. I congratulate them on the occasion of the silver, pearl and diamond jubilees. Not only have they done well, they have the promise of doing better. I wish the staff and students greater success and accomplishment. A single incidence which had taken place way back in 1983 perhaps made me to take a decision of enrolling myself for the nursing course. I was an athlete doing quite good in district and state level sports and there were opportunities for me to pursue sports as my career. I remember how people used to recognize me on the sports ground during inter school competitions and those days my sports performance was very high for the age. My Physical Director, Mrs Jayanthi from St Agnes School always had a special place for me in her heart and she made sure that I go everyday to the Mangala stadium at Lalbagh for the practice session. Somehow God's plan was different. A single incident made me change my most important decision related to my career. I said goodbye to my well gleaming sports life and the Mangala sports academy! In the year 2001 I got an opportunity to do my Masters in nursing from the Father Muller College of nursing, an institute which made me to choose nursing as my career & now an opportunity to work in this college. At this juncture I would like to say with pride that I joined for nursing not out of compulsion but, because of those two nurses from Father Muller Medical College Hospital. No doubt the medical team also worked hard for my sister's recovery, but those lovely angels in white had left an everlasting impression on me. I could sense the purity of their work. Father Muller is known for the Nursing care and we need to keep up that grace while working with the sick and needy to put their life at ease. Though I cannot remember the names of those nurses still they are in my thoughts forever. Now I can say that behind my success in nursing there stands Father Muller Institution. Thank you my Alma-Mater for showering all your blessings on me.

An Interview with Rev. Fr Peter Noronha, Founder Director of Father Muller College of Nursing

Good evening Rev. Father Peter Noronha, Could you please tell us a bit of the history of the Nursing Training at Father Muller campus?

When I came to Father Muller's we had only the school of nursing but we were well known for the quality of education we



provided for our students. Breech Candy Hospital, Bombay was one of the famous hospitals that time. They used to recruit our students even without asking them to appear for an interview. Because of the quality training we gave were famous for the quality care for our patients.

What were the driving factors for starting a training school/college for Nursing?

I had visited the United States once where I could meet many of our students who were working there. When I interacted with them I realized that they were struggling there for a career growth as they had only diploma in Nursing. That was the time I decided to start a college of nursing so that our graduates would have safe and secured job opportunities abroad.

25 years ago, when we started the college, there were three clear objectives before us:

1. To give a bright future to the students with the possibility of post graduation and research.

- 2. To make Father Muller's a pioneer and leader in nursing education at a time when the whole of Karnataka was sleeping over the need.
- 3. The third objective was purely selfish. The Governing Board felt that B.Sc teaching programme would produce adequate number of graduate nurses to be employed at Father Muller's itself, so that we would continue to be leaders and provide the best nursing care.

I am glad that the three objectives have been realized and the college of Nursing has become a gem of purest ray as the poet said.

Who were all the other motivating members who were there along with you in establishing this college?

Father Muller College of Nursing was born out of the sagacity and vision of Bishop Basil, who personally came to Bangalore keeping aside all the work and spoke to the Chief Minister. Earlier days and weeks had been spent planning for the College. The sisters from the School of Nursing were totally taken up with the idea of starting the first ever Nursing College in the private sector.

In no time they created space for the office and the classrooms. A library was quickly developed. We got a very good response when we advertised for the staff. Lt Col. Miss Thiagarajan, an Army Nurse, was a prize catch. She was appointed as Principal. She was a great person and an able administrator. With her experience and military background, she

developed and put in place a wonderful system of management to train nurses in compassionate care. It was her efforts that put the college on a sound footing. She was able to look ahead of the times and

ensure that proper conditions were created for the steady growth of the college.

All this was possible because of the vision of Bishop Basil, the support of the Governing Board, headed by Bishop A.P. D'Souza, the guidance of successive Directors and administrators and the staff and students of the college.

What were the risks and the obstacles you had to face at the point of starting the college of nursing?

I never dreamt that God would keep me so long to see the Pearl Jubilee of this college. I still remember the day almost 30 years back when I stood in Bangalore, it was biting cold. That evening I made a phone call to Bishop Basil and explained to him why he should come to Bangalore the very next day. We had an appointment with the chief minister, Mr Ramakrishna Hegde in the Vidhana Soudha. We reached there early and waited for him. He spotted us at the entrance, came to speak to us and took us to his office. We explained to him the difficulties we were having in getting permission to start a Nursing College. Our doctors are highly qualified, quite a lot of them FRCP and FRCS, but we had no nurses with B.Sc qualification. Apart from one Govt nursing college in Bangalore, there was no other college in Karnataka state. What impressed the chief minister was the concern expressed by a private institution to upgrade nursing education. Even when the health minister was opposed he was clear that he wanted good hospital care in Karnataka. He immediately called for our file, took out our application and put down his signature of approval.

How do you feel now watching the college's steady growth to the pinnacle of perfection?

I watch the growth of this institution like a mother watching the growth of a child. It gives me lot of happiness and satisfaction that my little effort has made this dream come true. The credit also should go to the Sisters of Charity as they worked in every teaching department of the new college of nursing.

Is there any other memory of the college which you would like to share?

There was a small boy in a school who had to face a test of singing a group song which was to be sung on the school day. He was very much excited and wanted to be chosen, but his mother knew that his singing was rather poor. She feared how the boy would react if he was not selected. In the evening she went to the school gate to pick him and bring him home. The little boy came rushing to her with eyes shining with pride and excitement. "Guess Mummy," he shouted, "I have been chosen to clap and cheer when they finish the song".

This is how I feel today, because I have a feeling that I too have been chosen to cheer and clap. I know that when I clap and cheer the College of Nursing today, I do it sincerely, because, this college has done all of us proud. It has indeed become the pioneer in nursing education and there is promise of greater things to come.

What would be your piece of advice for the present generation of our campus?

My advice to them would be to deliver the best quality care for their patients, have love for their Alma Mater and keep up the name wherever they work. Please maintain your leadership and do things which others can follow. Continue learning new things, and look for specializations that are necessary because the world of medicine is changing very fast.

An Interview with Sr Edmund, Former Principal of Father Muller School of Nursing

Dear Sister,

Greetings of the Season from Father Muller School and College of Nursing for one year at Delhi again and P.C.B.Sc Nursing course at Father Muller College of Nursing. All this time I worked only at Father Muller School of Nursing and finally



Could you please elaborate a bit on how you had taken the responsibility as the principal of Father Muller School of Nursing?

I came to Father Muller's in 1959 as a student of General Nursing and midwifery. 1962 I completed my course and joined as a staff in the hospital in the St Joseph Leprosy ward assisting a physician who came from Switzerland to care for the leprosy patients. In 1965 I was sent to Delhi to do my Public Health Nursing following which I did my Nursing Education course

the responsibility of the Principal was given to me. I have tried my level best to meet the expectations of the management, colleagues and students.

What all are the memories associated with your experience at Father Muller School of Nursing?

I always remember fondly the efforts made by the director Rev. Fr Marian Fernandes to initiate a nursing school, to prepare a team to serve the needy and poor. I

always feel privileged to be of the first batch of students at Father Muller School of Nursing as we were only 12 in our batch. As the nursing school was the only teaching unit of our institution at that time we got the maximum concern from everyone. Sr Gonzaga Pinto who handed over the principal's post to me was a guiding force for me always.

Who were the other faculty members who had worked along with you? Can you remember any one of them?

Though I am not able to remember all of them, I keep them in my prayer with a thankful heart. Sr Jacintha D'Souza, Prof Victoria and Prof Irene also have worked with me.

How was the climate of Nursing at Father Muller's those times?

It was like a one family where everyone had a lot of love, respect, care and concern for each other. Dr Mody, Dr Shetty and Dr Venkat Rao used to take classes for the students and caring for all of us. I remember our directors Rev. Fr Marian Fernandes, Rev. Fr Jacob Lobo and Rev. Fr Peter Noronha who took lot of care of the school of nursing. As I told you before since the school of Nursing was the only teaching institution, all of them had special concern for us. We used to feel very safe and secured with them.

How would you compare the image of nursing of those times with the present? Do you think it has become a respectable and independent profession?

I always feel the respect for our profession was there from beginning of my career from the co-workers and society. Society used to wait to get candidates from Father Muller's as they felt they were fully trained in patient care. We were known for the quality of care. Our students were recruited even without appearing for interview. However, now this profession has become more accepted among all the classes of society.

Do you feel that the present scenario of the institution has fulfilled your dreams? If not where are we lacking?

Yes, definitely... I never thought my institution would grow so much. Once we started the College of Nursing and Medical College the growth was very rapid and I used to watch that with so much admiration. I always feel proud seeing the growth of my Alma Mater.

What would be your advice for the present generation of nursing students?

I always feel nursing should improve more with quality than with quantity. So I would like to tell all that you should have more dedication and love for your patients. You should be more service minded than money minded. I wish everyone good luck for a bright future and wish my Alma Mater would grow still higher!!

we had the Capping ceremony on October 31, which changed our dress code from sari to white pant shirt and white cap. Mrs Indira Gandhi was shot dead on this day.

HOSTEL LIFE:- Initial days of hostel life were very tearful because of the ragging by the seniors. Slowly we too adjusted to it and it is our batch that made up its mind to stop the ragging which still followed. Evening we were enjoying Rosary, recreation, charismatic prayer service and Friday's



adoration by Fr Joe Mary Shenoy. We also had the duty of mess manager, gardening and watering as per roll number. Sunday was our most awaited day by our parent's visit who got a variety of eatables. Same evening we all friends used to have a kitty party by bunking the recreation. Watching chitrhar on each Friday and movie on Sunday along with the leprosy patients in the skin department was memorable one. Brinjal was the common vegetable in the cafeteria which we named as Fam Brinjal. Hotel Costa and Venus Café was our favorite food corners.

DIRECTOR & OUR TUTORS:- Fr Peter Noronha was our director who was loving & kind hearted. The Institution celebrated its golden jubilee during our stay. We all were waiting for his Christmas gift which included a variety of things. Fr Patrick & Fr Stany Tauro were our assistant directors.

Sr Loredana, Sr Anne Rose and Sr Gonzaga were our best tutors who taught us Nursing Arts, Medical Surgical Nursing and OBG subjects. Because of their vibrant knowledge and expert hand skill today we are shining all over the globe, including me in FMCI.

HOSPITAL & STUDENT LIFE:- Our day in clinicals started with prayer, night report reading, bed making, sponge bath, enemas, injection and iv infusion through butterfly needle. We had one month night duty posting with one senior. Our procedure tray was up-to-date because of the fear of Sr Cheriyol surprising rounds. Working in the leprosy & surgical wards by doing the wound dressing was my job satisfaction. Working in psychiatric wards was

challenging. Taking care of the chest ward (TB) with one hospital aide was very scary, which was at the corner of the campus.

LIFE STILL CONTINUES....:-When I was In-charge of ASHA KIRAN IV floor one fine morning I received a patient with appendicitis for admission. I sent two students to prepare the bed for him. After a little while I went to the room to introduce myself to the patient, I was not satisfied with the admission bed. I showed the procedure to the students, the patient who was watching me, asked "Sister, instead of teaching two students, why can't you teach a group of students?" I was motivated by his words and again I started my student life after a long gap of 18 years and I completed my PBBSc Nursing degree with distinction. With this I started my teaching profession in FMCI. Today I can proudly say that I am the happiest person in the Mullerian Family, where I can serve the suffering humanity and educate the young minds by teaching good values of life and profession to take care of the sick and the disabled.
